#### CÉSAR VAYSSIÉ

César Vayssié produces films and performances. His work sidesteps any classification at the intersection of visual arts and dance with untypical propositions about art and politics. In 1997 at Villa Medici in Rome he produces a full-length movie Elvis de Médicis. In 1999, he produces Les Disparates and has since then regularly worked with Boris Charmatz (Éducation, héâtre-élévision, Bocal, La Ruée...). His film UFE/UNFILMÉVÈNE-MENT) received the Georges De Beauregard National Award and the Audience Award at FID 27th International Film Festival Marseille 2016. César Vayssié pursues an empirical path which invests the field of performing art (he collaborates with Philippe Quesne, François Chaignaud, Jeremy Nedd, Ola Maciejewka...). During FIAC 2016 in Paris Vayssié premiered his performance COPROUDUCTION a series of improvised duets with experienced performers. The work of César Vayssié has been shown at Folkwang Museum in Essen, MOMI and MoMA New York, Tate Modern and ICA London, Nanterre-Amandiers, Centre Pompidou Paris, Tanzquartier Vienna and many places dedicated to visual art and performance. www.cesarvayssie.com

#### BORIS CHARMATZ

Dancer and choreographer Boris Charmatz submits the dance to formal constraints that redefine the field of its possibilities. From D' Aatt enen tionon (1996) to 10000 gestures (2017), he signed a series of landmark pieces in parallel with his activities as a performer and improviser. From 2009 to 2018, he directed the Musée de la danse / Centre chorégraphique national de Rennes et de Bretagne. He is an associate artist of the Avignon Festival in 2011, then of the Volksbühne Berlin during the 2017-2018 season. In January 2019 he launched Terrain, a structure located in the Hauts-de-France region. Charmatz is the author of several books, including Entretenir: à propos d'une danse contemporaine (Centre national de la danse / Les presses du reel, 2003), coauthored with Isabelle Launay; Je suis une école (Editions les Prairies Ordinaires, 2009), a work that retraces the adventure with Bocal; and Emails 2009-2010 (Les presses du réel, in partnership with the Musée de danse, 2013), co-authored with Jérôme Bel.

In 1999, through the eye of *César* Vayssié's camera, Les Disparates became not a "video-dance", a dance film or a musical comedy, but rather a short film, empirical and intuitive.

"Cinema allows the integration of dance into reality, the use of its various forms of expression as the peculiar codes of an ordinary story. Talking cinema has been around a long time. Les Disparates is a sound film, but without

words pronounced. Without dialogue, cinema often retains traces of theatrical vocabulary. It resorts to grimaces to make itself heard. Beyond that, the force of the image, the power of the choice of frame, movement and the multiplied points of view produce meaning."

A labyrinthine performance, constructed on the basis of an extensive canon of derivative gestures, Levée des conflits is impossible to recreate in its totality: it is a snapshot of 25 simultaneous gestures that the eye cannot take in with a single glance. Rather than try to capture something of this perceptual experience, César Vayssié opted for an unclassifiable film, something between an abstract bird's eye

view, a documentary, and a genre film. Shot in the Ruhr region, on the "Halde Haniel" mining site — an immense plateau shaped like a spiral — Vayssié's film propels the dance into an indeterminate zone, somewhere between science fiction and anthropology.
